



New at City Vet!

As something new City Vet can now offer veterinary chiropractic and acupuncture to all our patients.

Veterinarian Stina Aarup Hansen qualified as a vet in 2005 and completed the course in veterinary chiropractic in 2008, she has worked full time with veterinary chiropractic and acupuncture since September 2010. She will be available to treat your dog on selected dates, please ask the staff for exact dates.

The main purpose of chiropractic is to optimise health. The principles of chiropractic are based on the body's own innate recuperative powers and its relationship and integration with and by the neurological system. Veterinary chiropractic is a unique form of treatment that draws on both human chiropractic and veterinary medicine. Veterinary chiropractic care is a holistic approach to many health and performance problems in the dog.



Acupuncture is a treatment that stimulates nerves in the skin and muscle so increasing the release of natural painkillers. This modifies the way pain signals are received. The points chosen are based on knowledge of reflexes in the body, segmental theories and experience of points that usually works.

Chiropractic and acupuncture can be performed on all dogs, and all dogs will benefit from it. Typical problems will include:

- Dogs that just “aren’t doing right”
- Dogs with low grade lameness that there can’t be found any other reason for
- Old dogs that are a bit stiff and find it hard to get started after lying down
- As a part of rehabilitation after any injury, surgery or illness
- Any change in the dogs normal behaviour, which can be as a result of undefined pain, such as resistance to go for walks, hiding in unusual places, and mild unexplained aggression.
